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**MINUTES OF SWANA CALIFORNIA LEGISLATIVE
TASK FORCE MEETING, SACRAMENTO**

April 3, 2014

The Legislative Task Force (LTF) telephone meeting started at about 10:00 AM. The agenda is Attachment A. A list of the attendees is Attachment B (lists all 2014 LTF voting members and denotes those present). A quorum was present as there were 13 voting members (including one alternate) present, and at least one voting member from each chapter. Items from the agenda below were not all discussed in the agenda order listed.

I. BUSINESS ITEMS AND LTF ACTIVITIES

Introductions

The LTF members and non-LTF callers introduced themselves by roll call.

Approval of Minutes from March 2014 LTF Telephone Meeting

Nancy Ewert asked for a motion to approve the draft minutes.

Motion:

A motion was made by Mike Mohajer and seconded by Chris Hanson to approve the minutes from the March 2014 meeting. The motion carried, as all were in favor.

Treasurer's Reports

Glenn Acosta said that only new item was \$1,440 received in dues. Glenn Acosta noted he just got online banking transitioned over from Mark Bowers.

Motion:

There was a motion by Mike Mohajer to approve the treasurer's report. The motion was seconded by Mark Bowers. The motion carried, as all were in favor.

Website Redesign

Jesus Perez discussed that the tentative new format distributed by Shaw Yoder Antwih (SYA) looks good. Mike Mohajer discussed that the subcommittee that he was a part of had met in 2013 and he asked why the subcommittee had changed to the one that met in 2014. Nancy Ewert noted that the current subcommittee was formed at the November workshop. Mike Mohajer said he liked the Chris Hanson recommendations that were previously sent around by email. Chris Hanson briefly discussed her recommendations. It was discussed that the website subcommittee would review the content as Chris Hanson mentioned; and noted that the LTF members listed are outdated and need to be updated, among other updates.

Motion:

There was a motion by Mark Urquhart to move ahead with the budget increase previously decided at the workshop for Bill Pitt to redesign site and that the subcommittee should work with SYA to keep the content completed and as up to date as possible including working on the recommendations in prior Chris Hanson email on the item. The motion included that the subcommittee was confirmed as being comprised of Jesus Perez, Chris Hanson, Jim Babcock, Lisa Wood, and Larry Sweetser. The motion was seconded by Glenn Acosta. The motion carried, as all were in favor.

California Resource Recovery Association (CRRA)/ SWANA Conference Update

MB said he has not been coordinating with the conference committee to this point. There was discussion that early registration information did not get out to SWANA members timely and readily allowing a SWANA discount on registration, whereas CRRA member discounts were any easy default. Mark Bowers said he would check in with Dave Staub who is on the Gold Rush Chapter conference committee.

Solicitation Letter

Nancy Ewert noted that Glenn Acosta had streamlined the prior solicitation letter and officers had reviewed it and it will be sent out.

II. LEGISLATIVE ITEMS

Jason Schmelzer discussed a lot going on in the legislature and it is a busy time. Table 1 presents the LTF meeting matrix list of bills modified to incorporate a summary of the LTF meeting discussions for each bill of the matrix. Those that were not on the agenda or discussed, are noted. The *Summary of Discussion* column notes where motions were made or adopted and lists new category or positions resulting from the motions as well prior positions by the LTF.

III. REGULATORY/Budget Items

1. **75% Report from CalRecycle/AB 32 Scoping Plan** – It was discussed that it is urgent that LTF send comments out. Mike Mohajer discussed that banning organic waste from landfills and include landfills in cap-and-trade among other items in the Scoping plan are of major importance the LTF. He suggested that last year's comments are updated and submitted. Glenn Acosta suggested a strategy to inquire if the SWIG or others organizations have comment letters already in process, which the LTF could sign on to. Glenn Acosta said he will look into it.
2. Beverage Container Recycling – Nancy Ewert noted that a SWIG/LTF letter was going out today.
3. Lisa Wood discussed that the State Water Board (SWB) is having hearings on storm water runoff to which the LTF and some stakeholders are not being invited. Nancy Ewert noted that it is interesting that SWB may have concerns about the 75% Plan involving organics being banned from landfills and moved to composting in relation to concerns over impacts from storm water runoff from these facilities.

IV. OTHER ITEMS- Rumors and Gossip

William Merry discussed that California Air Resources Board (CARB) seems to be increasing inspection of landfills as their site had 20 to 30 people from CARB at site for training looking at surface sweeps, the leachate systems, and other items related to landfill gas. It was discussed that CARB is going over surface sweeps closely and do not seem to be trusting consultant sweep reports. Nancy Ewert said this item should be kept on the agenda.

Constance Hornig mentioned she would like to talk about state versus local issues on future LTF call.

V. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned about 12:06 PM.

Mike Mohajer discussed concerns about negotiations with CalRecycle as a lot of LTF position content and letters gets ignored.
