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**MINUTES OF SWANA CALIFORNIA LEGISLATIVE
TASK FORCE MEETING, SACRAMENTO**

May 1, 2014

The Legislative Task Force (LTF) telephone meeting started at about 10:00 AM. The agenda is Attachment A. A list of the attendees is Attachment B (lists all 2014 LTF voting members and denotes those present). A quorum was present as there were 13 voting members (including one alternate) present, and at least one voting member from each chapter. Items from the agenda below were not all discussed in the agenda order listed.

I. BUSINESS ITEMS AND LTF ACTIVITIES

Introductions

The LTF members and non-LTF callers introduced themselves by roll call.

Approval of Minutes from April 2014 LTF Telephone Meeting

Nancy Ewert asked for a motion to approve the draft minutes.

Motion:

A motion was made by Mike Mohajer and seconded by William Merry to approve the minutes from the March 2014 meeting. The motion carried, as all were in favor.

Treasurer's Reports

Glenn Acosta said he received \$7,700 in Agency contributions last month. The LTF fund balance will be up over \$43,000 after checks are deposited.

Motion:

There was a motion by Mike Mohajer to approve the treasurer's report. The motion was seconded by William Merry. The motion carried, as all were in favor.

Website Redesign

Chris Castrillo discussed that Bill Pitt has finished the website redesign. He said the website needs final input from the LTF to pass to Bill and then also approve \$500 payment to Bill for redesign. Nancy Ewert noted that the subcommittee could continue on the issue for updates. It was decided that the website will be launched including Jesus Perez's most recent comments. Maintenance recommendations beyond that point could be made to Jesus Perez as the task leader on subcommittee.

It was discussed that final letters would be copied to the LTF when they are sent, and also copied to Bill Pitts at same time for updating on the website.

California Resource Recovery Association (CRRA)/ SWANA Conference Update

Nancy Ewert said a policy roundtable by CRRA will take place on Sunday and Nancy Ewert and Mark Bowers will attend representing the SWANA LTF. Jason Schmelzer noted that getting legislative staffers at the conference will be difficult in August. It was noted that the LTF may be on opposite sides of issues but that could just be noted, if those items are discussed. It was decided that the panel should be California-centric and focus on the practical sustainable solutions and the commonality between SWANA LTF and

CRRA given that both are aligned on many topics.

II. LEGISLATIVE ITEMS

Table 1 presents the LTF meeting bill matrix circulated with the meeting packet, modified to incorporate a summary of the LTF meeting discussions for each bill of the matrix. Those that were not on the agenda or discussed are noted. The *Summary of Discussion* column notes where any motions were made or adopted and lists category or positions either from prior meetings or voted by motion.

III. REGULATORY/Budget Items

1. **SWRCB** - Larry Sweetser noted that the regulations were adopted on April 1, 2014. All compliance submittals will need to be made online, thus it will be open to public. The training program will probably be available next year including classroom and online training. If you are a professional engineer the program requirements to perform monitoring are less.
2. **Mattress Stewardship and Recycling** - Larry Sweetser said that the committee members have been appointed (noted on website). Jason Schmelzer said he would circulate the committee member list. Mike Mohajer noted that he could pass any concerns from the LTF to a committee member who also serves as staff of the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Task Force.

None were discussed.

V. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned about 11:52 AM.

Jason Schmelzer will confer with CalRecycle (Smithline) and others involved. Jason Schmelzer recommended the LTF holds back a little and takes its time on formalizing a position, while engaging SWIG and all the involved parties in the process. Jason Schmelzer said he has been at meetings, including a large one, and he has had discussions on the side also. It was discussed that the LTF needs to educate the author’s office on the issues. For example, it was discussed that author’s office has been used acceptance of green waste as ADC being taken free at disposal sites, which is not the case for a majority of sites. Another example was the author’s anecdotal discussions regarding greenhouse gas emissions (trucking to South America if composted without increasing GHG). There was considerable discussion on the issues and arguments surrounding this bill, including the \$1.40/ton that would be charged to ADC. The discussion included a broader theory that the CalRecycle fee should be placed across waste received at all solid waste facilities. Jason Schmelzer said this broader issue is not in related specifically to provisions of AB 1594 but could be brought up in white paper that could be taken directly to governor’s rather than CalRecycle, outside of lobby efforts on AB 1594.
