1. Administrative Items (10:00 – 11:00 a.m.)

- 1) Roll Call, Introductions
 - i. Meeting called to order at 10:02 a.m.
- 2) Approval of August 24, 2023 Minutes
 - i. Motioned, seconded, approved with the incorporation of comments from Mrs. Hanson.
- 3) Approval of August Treasurer's Report
 - i. Mr. Kernkamp reviewed the LTF's beginning balance, revenues, expenses, and ending cash balance for August 2023. The following financial data was summarized:
August 2023
 1. Beginning Balance: \$98,180.94
 2. Revenues: \$840.80
 3. Expenses: \$6,732.89
 4. Ending Cash Balance: \$92,288.85
 - ii. Motioned, seconded, approved.
 - iii. Mrs. Hanson to research options on how to invest some of the Cash Balance. Mr. Kobold suggested reaching out to Mandeep from SWANA Northern Chapter. Mrs. Hanson to consult with officers.

 1. Mr. Kernkamp mentioned he received work plan updates from some of the members. The goal is to fine tune the work plan at the annual meeting.
- 6) HHW / Battery Subcommittee Update
 - i. Mrs. Martin mentioned a first meeting was held. The subcommittee will work on developing a survey to query solid waste facilities (public and private) to understand impacts of HHW and batteries in waste stream. The goal is to educate the community, develop BMP's, and reduce risks and impacts to solid waste facilities. It was mentioned the Form 303 may be a source to understand facility inventory. Mrs. Jain mentioned Sunnyvale spends around \$200 - \$250K per year to process HHW materials.

 - i. New Logo
 1. Mr. Kobold stated SWANA National approved the use of their logo. SWANA National will draft a licensing agreement to utilize their logo. Thereafter Mr. Kobold will work on

updating the tax status to a 501C4. Mr. Kobold shared a draft SWANA California Chapters LTF logo with the LTF members to solicit feedback.



 - ii. Senate Bill 1, 2017 has provided grandfathered protection.
 - iii. If approved by OAL the ACF regulation will go into effective January 1, 2024.
 - iv. There is an optional phase in compliance schedule. Operators will have to give up their rights to Senate Bill 1. There is an exception for biomethane fleets. Biomethane vehicles will have to be in operators' inventory before 2024.
